ACCOUNTABILITY OF FUNDS

This funding request supports SCDOR strategies 2.2-Maintain strong governance of security processes to detect and prevent all privacy, cyber and physical security events and 2.3-Utilize advanced technology to detect and prevent physical intrusions, data breaches, website defacements and malicious system outages.

The additional spending authority is needed to address the escalating costs related to IT and security. Vendor prices for technology have increased dramatically due to inflation. The SCDOR manages costs by working with the Department of Administration on state-negotiated procurement and shared services but many cost increases are unavoidable. The additional authority will ensure the SCDOR continues to maintain the stringent security requirements needed to secure taxpayer information and keep up with the ever changing IT and security demands.

What specific strategy, as outlined in the most recent Strategic Planning and Performance Measurement template of agency's accountability report, does this funding request support? How would this request advance that strategy? How would the use of these funds be evaluated?

The SCDOR will expend these funds to address the rising inflationary costs related to

IT and security. The SCDOR will utilize the state's competitive procurement processes for this spending. Security and IT replacements and upgrades to cloud platforms are imperative for SCDOR to maintain the "next generation" of security standards to stay ahead of ever-increasing cyber security threats.

What individuals or entities would receive these funds (contractors, vendors, grantees, individual beneficiaries, etc.)? How would these funds be allocated—using an existing formula, through a competitive process, based upon predetermined eligibility criteria?

JUSTIFICATION OF REOUEST

The SCDOR needs this spending authority to maintain the agency's current security standards and to keep-up with ever changing IT and security demands. We continue to work with the Department of Administration as part of our transition to a cloud-based security platform. The SCDOR just signed a statement of work with the Department of Administration to move our taxpayer data to Microsoft's Cloud Platform. This "next generation" of security standards comes at a higher cost to the SCDOR since the IRS mandates that we implement the most stringent cloud requirements for their data. The SCDOR must also adhere to higher security requirements for on-premise equipment. Due to inflationary impacts, this equipment costs over 60% more now than when originally priced three years ago.

The SCDOR has been diligent in managing its finances over the last several years, which allowed the agency to accumulate the necessary funds for this project without having to ask for additional general fund dollars. The SCDOR's current other funds authority is not enough to support the transition to a cloud-based security platform. Without an increase to the current authority limit, the SCDOR will be unable to secure the "next generation" of security standards to protect confidential taxpayer information.
