The South Carolina State Library has been functioning with roughly the same number of staffing allocations for twenty years, however the manner in which we deliver services and meet our associated mandates has changed significantly.

As the State Documents Depository, the State Library plays a crucial role in preserving and documenting South Carolina's history. We have successfully secured funding for the acquisition of a state-of-the-art scanner and digitization equipment, significantly enhancing the library's digitization capabilities. This advanced equipment is designed to meet the current and future needs of the SCSL, ensuring the preservation of our state's historical documents with greater efficiency and precision. The State Library's collection includes materials dating back as far as the late 1700s, making this investment critical for the preservation of South Carolina's rich heritage. The scanner's advanced technology increases the number of items that can be scanned simultaneously, significantly boosting productivity.

JUSTIFICATION OF REOUEST

The South Carolina State Library (SCSL) serves as a vital resource for individuals who are blind or print-disabled through its Talking Book Services program. There has been a notable expansion in both enrollment and engagement with this essential service. From FY23 to FY24, the Talking Book Services program experienced a significant 15% increase in patronage, reflecting our efforts to enhance outreach and improve program visibility. Additionally, circulation figures have risen by over 11%.

During FY23, South Carolina public libraries circulated over 31 Million items and had 7.8 Million library visits. The South Carolina State Library provides direct expertise to public libraries, county library boards, and local governments.

The number of direct patrons the South Carolina State Library serves has grown exponentially from 1,064 in FY22 to 2,463 in FY23 to 4,016 in FY24. This remarkable rise in registrations reflects the successful outreach and promotional efforts implemented, as well as the increased engagement and utilization of library services by the community.

The South Carolina State Library's Discus program has been a trusted staple of education for 20 years providing access to an outstanding collection of electronic, subscription databases which are available 24/7. Discus is used extensively by all schools, including homeschools and virtual schools, and public and academic libraries. The State Library's electronic resources were accessed 18,808,129 times in FY2022.

The State Library is in a growth pattern of upward mobility and we require these additional positions to ensure we can meet the needs of our varied customer groups.

Disbursement of State Aid to County Libraries funding combined with local dollars provides funding to public libraries in South Carolina so that they may provide quality programs and products to South Carolinians. Last year public libraries had 7.8 million visits from members of their communities and circulated over 31 million items.

While each public library in our state receives some form of local support, it is the addition of state dollars that make many of the services and programs above the basic offerings possible. The request for an additional \$2,255,910 will increase State Aid to County Libraries from \$2.50 per capita to \$3.00 per capita. This funding will be used in a variety of ways depending on the needs of

The South Carolina State Library saves the State over \$54,000,000 dollars in cost avoidance every year by leveraging the State's funds for Discus. The South Carolina State Library negotiates statewide contracts with vendors for products included in Discus, for approximately \$2,700,000 per year. If each school and library purchased the products that are provided through Discus the cost would exceed \$56,000,000. Discus provides equal access to accurate information to all South Carolinians.

The South Carolina State Library's mission, vision, goals, and objectives center on creating an environment with equal access to information that supports growth both personally and professionally for individuals and businesses. We believe in leveraging our funding to provide access to quality resources. We have found that partnerships help us achieve our goals by sharing resources for a broader impact. Our partners include USC, SC Department of Education, the Columbia Museum of Art, SC ETV, the SC Arts Commission, and the South Carolina Human Affairs Commission.

The Discus collection of more than 70 subscription databases is available 24/7 and supports K-12 schools, public libraries, and academic institutions. All K-2 schools, including charter, virtual, public, home, and private, use Discus extensively for research, learning, and programming. Discus was accessed over 24 million times for full text retrievals and had an increase in usage in the following areas:

- PebbleGo Science usage increased 67%
- PebbleGo Next Biographies increased 82%. Gale in Context: Biography increased 8%. Gale in Context: Elementary increased 25%.
- LearningExpress Library increased 4%.
- TumbleBooks Library increased 3%.

SUMMARY

In the fall of 2021, the State Library announced a three-year \$1.5 million partnership with the SC Department of Education to address the continuing academic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic by ensuring funding for Tutor.com. Utilizing the American Rescue Plan Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ARP ESSER) Fund, the Tutor.com service provides equal access to individualized learning for all students and families. Tutoring is available for English and Spanish speakers 24/7 and offers access to highly qualified tutors in more than 200 subject areas. The State Library plans to continue to offer Tutor.com after this partnership ends.

The Tutor.com platform includes additional tools that are becoming very popular with students, including practice quizzes, SAT/ACT Essentials, Skill Center assistance, and Video Library views. The tutoring hours are the most used aspect of Tutor com, and the ability to re-watch previous tutoring sessions is the second most used feature of Tutor com, with 98% of respondents glad that Discus offers this

The Discus Training and Outreach Coordinators presented to 57 groups, including school districts, non-profits organizations, educators, academic communities, and state agency partners. These specific training sessions were attended by 701 attendees. There were also 20 live webinars hosted by vendor partners and the Discus Virtual Training Coordinator. These sessions were open to educators, parents, and the public, with 124 attendees and 207 recordings viewed throughout the year. Discus exhibited 22 times at First Steps programs, family literacy nights, statewide and regional conferences, and homeschool expos reaching 6,095 attendees.
