The SCFC currently uses USDA Forest Service grant funds to support 3 FTEs that are focused on wildfire prevention, community preparedness, and fuels mitigation around homes, neighborhoods, and communities with significant wildfire risk. Changes in this federal grant program restricts the use of these funds for salaries putting these employees' jobs at risk. Acquiring state funding will allow this critical work to continue.

JUSTIFICATION OF REOUEST

We are requesting \$345,000 in our Forest Protection section to shift 3 current federally funded positions to state funds. Since 2014, salaries for all SCFC personnel with full-time responsibilities for implementing fire prevention efforts, community wildfire planning, fuels mitigation planning, and sub grant awards have been supported by USDA Forest Service Hazard Mitigation grant funds. This critical work reduces the number of wildfires that occur, ensures that communities at risk are identified and provided with plans for wildfire preparedness and response, and that fuel accumulations within and surrounding communities with significant wildfire risk are reduced. Changes in grant guidance in FY23 indicated that the use of these grant funds for salaries is discouraged, and that as funding becomes more competitive, salary monies will be less available and harder to obtain, putting these positions at risk. With current federal funding we will only be able to sustain these positions through FY 2025, which makes the receipt of state funding for these positions imperative.

SCFC lacks funding to maintain fire prevention education and community preparedness staff. Wildfire occurrence will likely increase as prevention efforts decline at a time when more citizens, homes, and communities are at high risk from wildfires. Acres burned and structures lost will likely increase, and wildfires will become larger and present more risk to first responders conducting fire suppression. Studies conducted by the USDA Forest Service have documented that every dollar spent on wildfire prevention results in a savings of \$35 in wildfire suppression costs, illustrating the importance of a focus on wildfire prevention efforts.

JUSTIFICATION OF REQUEST

The SCFC currently has seven mechanics, and one supervisory mechanic based in regional maintenance shops. These mechanics perform critical repairs to firefighting equipment in both field and shop settings and conduct general maintenance to ensure readiness. Mechanics at the SCFC are required to have unique skills to maintain and repair the specialized equipment necessary to conduct the agency's wildland fire mission. This equipment includes 160 frontline firefighting dozers, 10 wheel and tractor trailer transports, fire plows, fire tracks, 60 Type 6 engines, portable pumps, UTV/ATVs, farm tractors, and road vehicles with gas and diesel engines. These positions require responding to fire scenes at night, on weekends, and on holidays, as well as rotating weekend and on-call status. SCFC mechanic salaries have been stagnant for years and have not kept pace with current industry rates. This has led to challenges in recruiting qualified applicants as positions have become vacant. Retention of current mechanics is also becoming more challenging as pay rates in the private sector continue to rise. We are requesting funding of \$160,000 to increase mechanic salaries to align with the state-wide averages for those classifications.

We are also requesting 1 FTE and \$110,000 to add a new mechanic/supervisor position in the Piedmont Region and \$10,000 in additional operating funds to support this position. This will improve safety by ensuring that more than one mechanic is present when major repairs are conducted, improve efficiency by adding another skilled mechanic to our largest geographic region, and provide a career advancement opportunity for mechanics.

Not funding this request could lead to reduced readiness to respond, increased risk to the public from wildfires, and increased wildfire size.

The bulk of this funding request is to support the ongoing costs of a new computer aided dispatch (CAD) solution. Our current provider is discontinuing operations by the end of 2024, leaving us without system support. CAD plays a mission-critical role in our wildland fire dispatch operations and without support, system errors may be unresolvable. When dispatchers receive notifications and enter wildfire locations, the system promptly presents the closest available resources for dispatch. This automated process reduces response time due to dispatchers not needing to manually refer to paper maps, work schedules, and locations of other incidents to determine what resources are available to dispatch.

JUSTIFICATION OF REQUEST

Addressing forest health issues is an integral part of sustainable forestry. Pests, diseases and invasive plants pose threats to the health of South Carolina's forests. Forest health staff survey for, identify, and make recommendations to mitigate these threats, while also educating the public on recognizing these threats. Federal funding has supported important forest health activities in South Carolina, including the salaries of three full-time staff, education of Forestry Commission personnel and citizens, surveying for forest pests and diseases, diagnosing forest health issues for citizens, and applying mitigation activities to reduce the impact of these pests and diseases. However, federal funding for forest health in South Carolina, including the Southern Pine Beetle Prevention Program, has declined by 21% and salaries for forest health staff have increased by 25% between 2015 and 2024. This has reduced our operating budget by 39% over the same period, resulting in a 46% reduction in acres receiving treatments for southern pine beetle prevention and a 76% reduction in survey flights. As the "Wall of Wood" matures and mills close, we expect to see more southern pine beetle activity in our state with little cost-effective means of managing outbreaks. South Carolina continues to combat new invasive species and those that are already here will be more costly to mitigate. For example, although emerald ash borer is already in the state, only a fraction of its impact has been felt as it has not yet moved through the piedmont and the coastal plain. Using the federal funding for operating costs will dramatically increase the acreage we are able to serve; more than 30% based on previous years' average funding. We will be better positioned to help landowners implement management strategies that reduce the incidence of pests and keep South Carolina's forests healthy and productive.

We are requesting \$337,000 to shift 3 current federally funded positions to state funds. Providing funds for salaries and fringe will free up federal funds to expand forest health surveys, outreach to the public, and to provide more cost-share to landowners for southern pine beetle prevention and control.

If this request is not funded it will result in reduced surveys of pests and diseases, reduced site visits to landowners and reduced access to forest health expertise that will result in increased losses across the state's forestland.

Operating funds will be used to pay for professional services related to due diligence costs for land conservation projects and to cover equipment, supplies and travel costs for the new FTE following the state procurement code.

The state lands coordinator position is currently funded from State Forests revenue but only a portion of the responsibilities are concentrated on SCFC State Forest lands. This position is responsible for directing the forest management efforts on South Carolina's State Forests; coordinating the statewide forest management on other SCFC lands; and collaborating with federal agencies, municipal and county governments, and other state agencies on the management of forestlands held by these organizations within our state.

We are requesting \$140,000 to shift 1 FTE from other to state for the State Lands Coordinator in our Forest Management division. The salary and fringe of this position is currently being covered by revenue from the sale of forest products from SCFC State Forests. Covering the salary and fringe of the State Lands Coordinator with State Forests revenue is burdensome to the state forests system and limits value added projects that could be done on the ground to benefits citizens that use those forests. Covering these costs with state funds will allow more of the State Forests revenue to be retained within the state forests system and used to better manage these properties to create more value for the citizens of SC.

The SCFC has recently expanded program efforts to identify and evaluate potential forestland conservation opportunities and coordinate with agency personnel and conservation partners to acquire conservation easements and/or fee simple title on working forest lands for sustainable multiple-use management. The agency currently manages over 100,000 acres and is looking to strategically expand its conservation footprint across the state to provide benefits for the citizens of SC in alignment with Governor McMaster's conservation goals and to protect the timberland base that supports SC's \$23 billion forest industry. With rapid population growth in SC and the accompanying development pressure it is critical that conservation efforts to sustain SC's working forests be expanded. Unfortunately, current agency staffing levels are inadequate to support this expansion.

JUSTIFICATION OF REQUEST

In FY24 the SCFC evaluated 13 land conservation projects encompassing more than 82,000 acres. Over the last 4 fiscal years the agency has added over 6,673 acres to the state forest system in two counties. Additionally, in FY24 SCFC was named as long-term steward of the 4,878- acre Millaree tract. This tract is a wetland mitigation project and will be transferred to SCFC upon completion of mitigation work. The workload associated with these projects have stretched staff capacity to its limit and this understaffing severely limits the agency's ability to capitalize on strategic conservation opportunities in a very competitive real estate market. Without strong support from partnering conservation agencies and non-profit partners the agencies the agency would not have been able to achieve the work that has been accomplished to date.

We are requesting \$110,000 and 1 new FTE for a full-time, permanent Conservation Coordinator who will promote the conservation of forestland through fee simple acquisition and/or conservation easements for its many benefits and serve as the project coordinator for all SCFC land conservation projects. This position will also serve as the Good Neighbor Authority contact for the Sumter National Forest. We are also requesting \$104,000 in operating funds to support this position and due diligence efforts related to agency land conservation projects.

If not funded the State Lands Coordinator position will continue to be covered by state forest revenue and there could be missed opportunities for land protection which may result in conversion of these lands to other uses.

Prescribed fire is an important forest management tool that benefits forests and wildlife, while also significantly reducing the risks and impacts of wildfire. As such, education and collaboration around prescribed fire along with the actual implementation of this practice are critical components of the Forestry Commission's work each year. Unfortunately, the agency's current capacity limits its ability to leverage this tool to its maximum potential in service of both our mission and the citizens of SC.

Over the last four years, the agency has only been able to complete an average of 58% of contracts for prescribed burning on private lands. This means over 40% of agency customers are not achieving their desired objectives regarding the use of prescribed fire each year. Some of this is weather-driven, but it is largely driven by inadequate capacity.

JUSTIFICATION OF REQUEST

Furthermore, accomplishments on the agency's state forests have only averaged 1,464 acres per year, which is well short of our goal of 2,500 acres. Again, a shortfall of over 40% due to inadequate capacity. Prescribed burning by all sources has averaged 444,608 acres over the last five years – less than half of our statewide goal of 1 million acres per year. To help make up these lost opportunities a significant investment is needed in the agency's capacity to deliver its prescribed fire programs.

We are requesting \$110,000 and one FTE to hire a full-time Prescribed Fire Coordinator. This position will help promote prescribed burning for its many benefits and improve efficiency in the allocation of prescribed burning resources.

A focus of this position will be the development of prescribed burning associations across the state. Through prescribed burning associations, landowners team up to get more burning accomplished. Enabling landowners to carry out burns safely and efficiently is the most effective way of reaching our statewide goals.

The position will also coordinate efforts with seasonal contract crews and partner agency crews to ensure efficient and effective delivery of prescribed burning services on private lands, state forests and other state lands. The companion non-recurring request for contract prescribed burning crews will allow us to triple the amount of prescribed burning on state forests while simultaneously significantly increasing, by approximately 20%, the amount of acreage the agency will be able to prescribed-burn on private lands.

These funds will be used to create a new critical position within the Resource Development Division of the South Carolina Forestry Commission. The position will be classified as an Economic Development Officer I with responsibilities for the recruitment of both primary and secondary forest industry to the state of South Carolina. The salary and fringe benefits of the position will be \$109,000. Operating funds for travel costs, meeting registrations, and contracting fees are expected to be \$41,000.

Within the State of South Carolina, there does not currently exist one unique position that is dedicated to the recruitment of primary and secondary forest industry. The South Carolina Department of Commerce assigns companies to project managers as requested by the company. The workload is assigned to Commerce's project managers in a way to balance the workload although most agribusiness projects are assigned to one specific project manager. However, project managers with Commerce have not historically been charged with the responsibility of "mining" projects by actively researching and recruiting companies.

The process of "mining" projects is most effectively accomplished by researching forest products trends and attending key industry conferences where business contacts can be made. There is a considerable amount of time and expense required to travel both domestically and internationally to make these contacts. Examples of key meetings include the Mass Timber Conference, typically held in Portland, Oregon and Forest Economic Advisor meetings held in various location worldwide.

The Resource Development Division has three positions which each have roles that they play in economic development: a forest analyst, a forest product marketing specialist and the division director who leads the effort for four program areas including 1) Nursery and Tree Improvement, 2) Forest Industry Analysis (FIA), 3)Environmental Management and 4) Economic Development. Within Economic Development, the director takes the lead on industry recruitment, but his time is spread over several program areas. The creation of this new Economic Development Officer I position will provide a full-time individual to this critical need.

JUSTIFICATION OF REQUEST

In our most recent report in 2020, South Carolina's forest industry had \$23.2 billion in economic activity. Over 100,000 citizens supported their families through employment, either directly or indirectly, by the forest products industry. Among manufacturing industries, forest industry was ranked #1 in employment, #2 in labor income, and #3 in economic output. However, by 2023, the economic stresses related to the COVID pandemic and global competition, resulted in two large paper mills closing, resulting in 3.2 million tons of lost fiber market in South Carolina. This began a ripple effect within the industry, resulting in the closure of 4 chip mills across the state. By 2024, the closure or reduction in production has resulted in the loss of over 5 million tons of fiber. Just in 2024, both Interfor and Georgia Pacific have announced the closure of sawmills in Summerville and Prosperity, respectively. The most recent announcement has been the announced closure of International Paper's mill in Georgetown which alone generated \$874 million in economic activity in Georgetown County.

Although there have been some success stories in recent years, such as the startup of the West Fraser OSB plant in Allendale County and the expansion of other mills, the overall loss of fiber markets has overwhelmed the forestry community, especially the forest landowners who grow the feedstock that is necessary for industry health. Without markets for their timber, competing land uses will eventually win out and South Carolina will be growing rooftops and solar farms instead of trees.

It is imperative that the recruitment of forest industry to South Carolina be elevated to a higher priority. That requires the creation of a full-time, dedicated individual who will not be deterred from the research of forest product trends, the identification of actively growing companies, and the recruitment of those companies. If these funds are not approved, the Forestry Commission will continue our efforts to the best of our

ability, but in all likelihood, our successes will not keep pace with the industry setbacks and the downward spiral in economic contribution of forest industry will continue.

JUSTIFICATION OF REQUEST This is a one-time request to purchase a truck for the prescribed burn coordinator if that position is funded. We are also requesting funding for contract crews to increase the amount of prescribed burning on state forests as well as on private lands. State forests serve as demonstration areas of sustainable forestry practices, so increasing the amount of burning on these lands will help meet this mission. During the past five years, an average of only 1,464 acres were prescribed burned on state forests, while the potential acres is close to 10,000 (with ideal weather conditions and other factors). Funding for contract prescribed burning crews will enable us to realistically burn approximately 4,000 acres per year, which would reduce wildfire risk, improve wildlife habitat, and enhance tree growth.

The five-year average of prescribed burning by agency personnel on private lands is approximately 9,000 acres. Funding for contract prescribed burn crews will enable us to carry out burns on close to 11,000 acres.

If this non-recurring request is not funded prescribed burning will continue at a level that does not meet agency goals and wildfire risk will stay at a high level in many areas and the other benefits from prescribed burning will not be realized.

LONG-TERM PLANNING AND SUSTAINABILITY

The funds requested will be used for due diligence on land acquisition projects and for fee simple purchase of land acquisition. We intend to leverage these funds with other agency funds, grants, federal funds, and private funds to secure land to be added to our state forests system. All land acquired will be managed for multiple use, meaning we will manage the asset for the greatest good of South Carolina and its citizens through sustainable timber management, wildlife management, recreational use, and ecosystem benefits such as clean water, clean air, carbon storage, and much more. The SCFC manages its state forests without recurring state funding, operating almost entirely off the receipts from forest product sales. In addition, 25% of the gross revenue from these sales is provided to the county where the property is located to support the school system.

What other funds have already been invested in this project (source/type, amount, timeframe)? Will other capital and/or operating funds for this project be requested in the future? The agency currently manages more than 100,00 acres and is looking to strategically expand our conservation footprint across the state to provide benefits for the citizens of SC. Agency staff work collaboratively with a wide range of conservation partners to identify strategic tracts that will be a good fit for our state forest system. Partners include state agencies such as SC Conservation Bank, SC Department of Natural Resources, SC Office of Resilience, SC Parks, Recreation and Tourism, etc. and non-profit partners like Open Space Institute, The Conservation Fund and The Nature Conservancy. Collaboration with a large group of partners enables the SCFC to leverage state funds against federal and private funding to achieve maximum impact.

This request will provide the funds necessary for due diligence and land acquisitions and would allow the SCFC to act quickly in a very competitive real estate market. Having a dedicated source of funds for SCFC land conservation would enable the agency to:

React quicker in the current real estate market. Purchase strategic properties in areas of the state where forestland conservation is

- needed most in the face of increasing development pressures;
- 3. Bring additional dollars to further leverage federal and private funding.

SUMMARY

Currently, there are several high conservation priority projects that are of interest to the SCFC. We have identified two different properties that these funds may be used to help with the acquisition and permanent protection. These funds are vital to the acquisition and protection of these working forests from development. Strengthening the SCFC's forestland conservation focus is vitally important to allow the agency to act efficiently and compete effectively in the face of rising development pressures to acquire strategic forested properties important for sustainable timber production, wildlife habitat and outdoor recreation to benefit South Carolina citizens.

The Forestry Commission's mission is protecting, promoting, and enhancing the state's forests for the benefit of all. To achieve this mission, agency employees provide numerous services to the citizens of South Carolina and to forested lands themselves. Forestry Commission personnel not only protect the forest lands and surrounding communities from wildfires, but they also provide outreach services to landowners who enable forestry to be a top industry and economic driver in South Carolina.

In order to accommodate a 3% budget reduction, the Forestry Commission will have to eliminate 16 FTEs. These FTEs directly serve the citizens of South Carolina. By eliminating these positions, services that are currently provided will be significantly reduced. This will be a negative effect on the economic value that the forest industry provides to the state and will further reduce the Commission's ability to protect the forest resource, homes, other structures and lives.

The agency will use vacant positions if available at the time of the cut. However, if positions are not vacant, the agency will use other methods to reduce state operating funds. Such methods will include a combination of elimination of at-will employees, temporary employees, furlough of current employees and/or a reduction in operating expenditures

AGENCY COST SAVINGS PLANS

The agency evaluates operations throughout the year to ensure we are operating efficiently and effectively. In FY2018 the agency entered into a 10-year public-private partnership with Arborgen at the Commission's Taylor Nursery. The partnership allows the agency to continue to provide state-of-the-art seedlings to forest landowners for tree planting in the future while mitigating agency budget shortfalls associated with the operation of the nursery. As a result of this agreement, we continue to see savings of approximately \$200,000 annually in salary/fringe and operating costs associated with nursery operations. The agency has repurposed the salary and fringe funds to assist with our recruitment and retention efforts. The operating funds saved are being used to bolster our Tree Improvement program to ensure SC landowners have access to the best available genetics that will be critical to maintaining and improving the productivity and health of our forests in the future.

During FY 2023-2024 a total of 126 warning tickets were issued. Through the use of warning tickets versus courtesy summons for documented violations the expected saving in fines and court costs is \$137,025. This is based on the maximum fine of \$500 plus included court assessments. Case prosecution would take approximately 15 minutes per case multiplied by 126 violations, which saved 31.5 hours of officer court time. Based on the average hourly rate of \$25.07 per hour this provided an additional savings of \$790. This saved the public 31.5 hours of personal or employer time due to not being required to attend court. Court personnel also saved 31.5 hours due to not hearing these cases.
