Coronavirus Relief Fund – SCEMD Report for Act #142 – October 1, 2020

1) State and local government expenditures / estimates for COVID 19 response:

In accordance with section 502 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, 42 U.S.C. 5121-5207 (the “Stafford Act”), eligible emergency protective measures taken to respond to the COVID-19 emergency may be reimbursed under Category B of FEMA’s Public Assistance program. A 25% cost-share is required. SCEMD has received CARES Act funding for the cost share requirement for eligible state and local government applicants. Cost share reimbursements will begin in October.

Part B: Vendor contracted to develop a supply chain plan and long-term strategy for warehousing and managing stock rotation of personal protective equipment.

- \$17,203.75 obligated and to be reimbursed with CARES Act funding from the PPE stockpile grant.

Part C: State level solicitation 5400020180 competitively advertised to secure vendor-managed services for the long-term warehousing, management and stock rotation of SC’s Personal Protective Equipment inventory. An award announcement will be made in October 2020. This contract will be funded with the allocation for PPE / management.

4) EMPG-Supplemental

The Emergency Management Performance Grant-Supplemental program is authorized by Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, Div. B (Pub. L. No. 116-136) and the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, Pub. L. No. 93-288 (codified as amended at 42 U.S.C. § 5121 et seq.). Title VI of the Stafford Act authorizes FEMA to make grants for the purpose of providing a system of emergency preparedness for the protection of life and property in the United States from hazards and to vest responsibility for emergency preparedness jointly in the federal government and the states and their political subdivisions. This grant requires a dollar for dollar non-federal matching requirement and expires on January 26, 2022.
